5 Report of 2002-2003 Conference Activities

(reports on any regular/special sessions, tutorials, etc.)

ISCAS (K. Parhi): 250 papers submitted, 150 papers accepted, 3 tutorials related to VLSI, tutorials on SoC, deep submicron, security

SIPS (K. Parhi): 97 attendees, 40 papers accepted out of 100 papers, Panel session on Nanotechnology

GLS-VLSI (M. Stan): Doubled the number of submissions, 25% more attendance, about 80 attendees

MWSCAS: held in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Introduced exhibits for first time, Panel session on telecommunications

SoC (Radu Secareanu): ASIC Conf. is now known as SoC Conference.

ICCD : Conference participation has come down from 1000 to 100 over the last couple of decades. The conf. is trying to attract more attendees and changing location to bay area.

IWSoc (W. Badawy): July 5-7, 2002, Banff, AB, Canada (co-located with the CWSOC2002).

ICECS (M. Chrzanowska-Jeske): 400 papers submitted, 240 accepted, 2 special sessions. Attendance about 300. Special Issue on papers of the conference on Journal of Analog Circuits and Systems

APCCAS: moved to Singapore from Bali, Indonesia

ISLPED: Held in Monterey, Calif., 2 parallel tracks held like every year

PATMOS: 2 members were involved in the TPC

TAU: held in Austin, excellent tutorials and panels. About 75 attendees

6 Report of 2003-2004 Conferences

ISCAS (K. Parhi): Volunteers were sought to organize special sessions, tutorials, etc.

SIPS (M. Sunwoo): Will be held in Seoul during Aug. 27-29, 2003. There were 152 papers submitted and 67 papers were accepted.

GLS-VLSI (M. Stan): Will be held in Boston next year. To improve paper quality, a best paper award will be established. This year's program chair will be general chair next year.

MWSCAS: will be held in Cairo in December. There will be coordinated tours. Final call for papers, tutorials, etc. are available from <http://www.mwscas.org>

SoC Conf.: will be held in Portland. 164 papers were submitted. 44% papers were accepted. Number of submissions is up by 25%.

SoC Symp.: will be held in November in Tampere, Finland. Paper submission deadline is May 30th.

ICCD: Papers are currently being reviewed.

IWSoc (W. Badawy): the 3rd IEEE International Workshop on SOC; June 30-July 2, 2003 Calgary, Canada (co-located with the TR-Labs wireless annual workshop).
